Notes Regarding Institutional Exceptions or Special Cases:

**UH:** BA students must have documented foreign language proficiency in one foreign language at the second semester of 2000-level or higher. It is recommended that students who intend to pursue a BA at UH complete foreign language courses through the second semester sophomore-level in place of either Elective or Minor Courses. Students with foreign language competency may satisfy part or all of this requirement by placement or credit by examination.

**UHCL:** For electives and “Choose two”, completion of GEOG 1303 for Social/Behavioral Core and HIST 2301, 2321, and 2322 is recommended

**TSU:** Student may take courses from TSU Institutional Option Core courses: COSC 1301 Intro To Comp Science I, MIS 204 Fundamentals of Info Systems, EDCI 210 Ins Tec, or one additional course from the Math, Life and Physical Sciences, English 2XX, Creative Arts, or Social and Behavioral Sciences listed in the General Education core. Minor is required, foreign language is not a requirement. Other Electives are true “free electives”.

**TWU:** Students should take World Civilizations I or II in Year 2.

UH: It is recommended that students pursuing the BS in Political Science take an additional higher-level MATH course in place of one Minor or Elective course. BA students must have documented foreign language proficiency in one foreign language at the second semester of 2000-level or higher. It is recommended that students who intend to pursue a BA at UH complete foreign language courses through the second semester sophomore-level in place of either Elective or Minor Courses. Students with foreign language competency may satisfy part or all of this requirement by placement or credit by examination.

PVAMU: In order to fulfill the 6 SCH of Life and Physical Sciences requirements, students are advised to take a BIOL, CHEM, PHYS, or PHSC sequence. Students are encouraged to take foreign language requirement in first two years of study.

TWU: No equivalent for GOVT 2304, will count as elective. BA requires 12 SCH of the same foreign language. Recommend students take English Literature course as an elective or 040 core.

UH: Students pursuing a BS in Psychology should take an additional MATH course in place of one minor or elective course. UH BA students must have documented foreign language proficiency at the second semester of 2000-level or higher in one foreign language. For students intending to pursue a BA at UH, completing foreign language courses through the second semester sophomore level in place of elective or minor courses. Students with foreign language competency may satisfy part of or all of this requirement by placement or by credit by examination.

TSU: PSYC 2319 Social Psychology is currently a 300-level course at TSU. PSYC 2320 Abnormal Psychology and PSYC 2330 Biological Psychology are currently 400-level courses at TSU. There is a proposal presently in the pipeline to move the three courses listed, Social Psy, Abnormal Psy, and Bio Psy from upper level to lower level courses to align with the FOS in January or February 2022.

PVAMU: PSYC 2319 Social Psychology and PSYC 2320 Abnormal Psychology are currently a 3000-level course at PVAMU.

TWU: Will also take PSYC 2307 Adolescent Psychology.

**UHCL:** MATH 1314 is recommended for Math Core 020

**UH:** Students pursuing a BS in Sociology should take an additional higher-level MATH course in place of one minor or elective course. BA students must have documented foreign language proficiency at the second semester of 2000-level or higher in one foreign language. For students intending to pursue a BA at UH, completing foreign language courses through the second semester sophomore level in place of elective or minor courses. Students with foreign language competency may satisfy part of or all of this requirement by placement or by credit by examination.

**TSU:** Recommends that students choose courses in a designated minor where indicated. SOCI 2301 Marriage and Family and SOCI 2319 Minority Studies are currently 300-level courses at TSU. SOCI 1306 and MATH 1342 and PSYC 2317 not a field of study (FOS) course for Social Work; required for curriculum, but not defined as FOS courses.

**PVAMU:** In order to fulfill the 6 SCH of Life and Physical Sciences requirements, students are advised to take a BIOL, CHEM, PHYS, or PHSC sequence. Recommend students choose courses in a designated minor where indicated. SOCI 1306 Social Problems can satisfy SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES (080) or COMPONENT AREA OPTION ONE (Global Awareness - 090).

**TWU:** SOCI 2319 does not transfer but will count as a general elective. Students should take statistics course for Math core (020) requirement.

UHCL: PSYC 2301 is required for Social and Behavioral Sciences Core 080, BIOL 1406, 1408 or 2401 with the lab is required for one of the two Life and Physical Science Core 030, MATH 1314 is recommended for an elective, SOCI 1301 is a required elective.

PVAMU: BIOL 1308 Biology for Non-Science Major I required for 3 SCH of Life and Physical Science Core (030). SOCI 1306 Social Problems can satisfy SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES (080) or COMPONENT AREA OPTION ONE (Global Awareness - 090) or elective. MATH 1342 Statistics (prerequisite MATH 1314) or PSYC 2317 Statistics may satisfy Mathematics Core (020) or Support Area Requirement. Recommend SOCG 1301 General Sociology and ECON 2301 or 2302 be taken as an elective to satisfy Support Area requirement.

TWU: SOCW 2361 transfers but students will need to complete lab and 30 hours community service. SOCW 2362 and 2389 would transfer as general electives. Recommend students take Intro to Psychology for Social and Behavioral Sciences (080) Core and Speech/public speaking course as one of the electives.
