Notes Regarding Institutional Exceptions or Special Cases:

AC: ARTS 2348 not required. Students may want to take it as an elective depending on which institution they plan to transfer to. ARTS 1304 and 1312 are offered as electives.

COM: ARTS 1303 and 1304 – students take one, not both. requires in core for every degree PSYC 1300 (Psychology for Success). COM’s sciences courses are 4 SCH, resulting in 63 total SCH.

GC: Does not offer ARTS 2326, 2333, 2341, 2356, 2366.

TSU: There is no equivalent for ARTS 2313, 2341, 2356, and 2366.

UHCL: Does not offer ARTS 2348 Digital Media. Recommend students complete ARTS 2356 Photography I and ARTS 2316 Painting I for Major requirements. ARTS 1312 can be used to fulfill ARTS 3310 Sculpture requirement.

UH: ARTS 1312 transfers as ARTS 1397 and will count as a fundamental art elective.

ARTS 1317 is accepted and will count as a fundamental art elective. It is not equivalent to ARTS 3300 Advanced Drawing.

ARTS 2348 is accepted and will count as a fundamental art elective.

There is no equivalent for ARTS 2313 at UH; ARTS 2341 can transfer as ARTS 1397 and will count as a fundamental art elective.

For Photography 1 courses, material should be based in digital photography, not traditional photography methods.

The BA, Art requires students complete Drawing 1 and Sculpture 1; recommends Painting, Ceramics, and Photography; For the UH BA, Art Students must have 5 courses at the 1000-2000 level. If they transfer all 6 required courses here, they may have excess hours.

Arts Education can be pursued through a BA, Art with an Education minor.

PVAMU: There is no equivalent for ARTS 1317, 2313, 2326, 2333, 2341, 2346, 2356, 2366. Several of those courses are listed as 3000 and 4000 level courses. ARTS 2348 could transfer as DGMA 2317 Fundamentals of Digital Imaging.

TWU: ART 2423/1303 World Art History I and ART 2433/1304 satisfies Creative Arts Core (050).

This plan is more appropriate for the BFA in Art (Art Education), BFA in Art (Graphic Design) and BA in Art (Art History and Visual Culture) degrees.

For the BA in Art (Art History and Visual Culture) only take one ARTS elective course. We recommend students take 3-6 SCHs of a Language Other Than English (LOTE).

We recommend you only choose from the following courses to satisfy the degree program requirements: ARTS 2316 Painting I, ARTS 2326 Sculpture, ARTS 2333 Printmaking, ARTS 2346 Ceramics I, ARTS 2356 Photography I.

GC: Does not offer ARTS 2326, 2333, 2341, 2356, 2366.

COM: *Requires in core for every degree PSYC 1300 (Psychology for Success). Students choose ARTS 1303 OR 1304; Students must complete math during the first year.*

TSU: *There is no equivalent for ARTS 2311, 2313, 2341, 2356, 2357, and 2366.*

UH: *ARTS 1312 transfers as ARTS 1397 and will count as a fundamental art elective.
 ARTS 1317 transfers as a lower level fundamental arts elective. It is not equivalent to ARTS 3300 Advanced Drawing.
 There is no equivalent for ARTS 2313 at UH; ARTS 2341 can transfer as ARTS 1397 and will count as a fundamental art elective.
 ARTS 2348 is accepted and will count as a fundamental art elective.
 For Photography 1 courses, material should be based in digital photography, not traditional photography methods.
 At UH, each BFA has its own requirements. If students are not aware of these prior to enrolling in courses at 2-years, they may have excess hours. For specific details, reference UH Degree Maps for BFA in Graphic Design; Photography/Video; Painting; Sculpture. Students transferring to UH should choose the 3 courses based on one of these tracks to minimize credit loss.
 UH: All four BFA programs will require a competitive review (known as Block Review) and acceptance in order to be admitted to the junior/senior experience for each of programs. A student is allowed to go through this review twice in each program. Acceptance into the junior/senior experience is not guaranteed regardless of being admitted to the School of Art under a certain program.
 BFA, Graphic Design requires students complete Drawing 1 and Design 1; recommends Sculpture 1, Printmaking 1, Photography 1.
 BFA, Painting requires students to complete Drawing 1 and Painting 1; recommends Printmaking 1, Sculpture 1, Photography 1.
 BFA, Photography/Digital Media requires students to complete Photography 1; recommends Sculpture 1, Printmaking 1, Digital Tools.
 BFA, Sculpture requires students to complete Drawing 1, Sculpture 1, Ceramics 1; recommends Painting 1, Photography 1.*

PVAMU: *There is no equivalent for ARTS 1317, 2313, 2317, 2323, 2326, 2333, 2341, 2346, 2347, 2348, 2356, 2357, 2366. ARTS 2348 could transfer as DGMA 2317 Fundamentals of Digital Imaging*

TWU: *ART 2423/1303 World Art History I and ART 2433/1304 satisfies Creative Arts Core (050). TWU allows for 9 hours of 2000 level credit. This plan is more appropriate for the BFA in Art (Studio Art) degree.
 We recommend you only choose from the following courses to satisfy the degree program requirements: ARTS 2316 Painting I, ARTS 2326 Sculpture, ARTS 2333 Printmaking, ARTS 2346 Ceramics I, ARTS 2356 Photography I, ARTS 2323 Life Drawing*

Notes Regarding Institutional Exceptions or Special Cases:

UH: Admission to Dance BA and BFA program is by audition only.

Dance Education can be pursued through a BA, Dance with an Education minor.

DANC courses will be evaluated for the degree based on the proficiency demonstrated by the student. Student will be placed into the appropriate level based upon their audition. DANC 1245 and 1151 transfer as electives. DANC 2303 and 1305 satisfy Creative Arts Core (050). DANC 3302: Intermediate Technique & Theory is a junior-level dance technique class. If students take modern and ballet for 4 semesters at a community college (2-4 credit hours each semester), they should be ready to audition for DANC 3302 in their junior year.

While students need to audition for the UH Dance Program, they must also audition for the junior-level (DANC 3302) and senior-level (DANC 4302) technique classes. This audition happens the first day of classes.

TWU: DANC 2303 and 1305 counts as creative arts core equivalent. TWU TCCN equivalents: DANC 1151 Beginning Dance Performance; DANC 1201 Improvisation; DANC 2151 Intermediate Dance Performance; DANC 1305 Dance and Globalization; DANC 2247 Beginning Urban and Global Dance Practices.

GC: Does not offer ENGL 2321 British Literature, ENGL 2326 American Literature, ENGL 2331 World Literature, ENGL 2351 Mexican American Literature, or require a foreign language.

TSU: There is no equivalent for ENGL 2341 and 2351. Recommend students complete World Lit I and II in Year 2 elective category to meet TSU degree requirements.
